1 Corinthians 5:7 Get rid of the old yeast, so that you may be a new unleavened batch—as you really are. For Christ, our Passover lamb has been sacrificed.

Exodus 12:5-10

The lamb was selected because he had no blemish.

- Death had to happen because of the wages of sin
- Only a perfect sacrifice could satisfy the righteous requirement of a perfect God
- Israel deserved to die but their guilt was paid by a substitute
Romans 3:25, 26 (NKJ) | 1 John 2:2 (NKJ) | Isaiah 53:6 | John 1:29 | Rev. 13:8
Isaiah 53:6 (MSG) We're all like sheep who've wandered off and gotten lost. We've all done our own thing, gone our own way. And God has piled all our sins, everything we've done wrong, on him, on him.

The blood had to be applied to the door as a mark of Lordship.

- God's eyes were not on the people of the house, but on the blood of the sacrifice on the door. John 10:7-10
- Each household slaughtered their own lamb. Hebrews 9:26
- The roasting is a picture of judgment. Hebrews 9:27
- Confidence in the blood. Hebrews 10:19-23

Exodus 12: 11-13

The Lord Himself becomes a covering so the death angel would Passover.

Isaiah 31:5 (NLT) The Lord of Heaven's Armies will hover over Jerusalem and protect it like a bird protecting its nest. He will defend and save the city; he will pass over it and rescue it.

The Israelites ate the Passover lamb for _____ for the journey that was ahead of them.

John 6:53-58 | Matthew 4:4 | Ephesians 6:15

The Israelites were to eat all of the lamb and to eat with expectation of what the Lord was going to do.

Exodus 12:14-28

The Israelites were to spend a week getting all the sin (leaven) out of their lives.

- This is a picture of sanctification: Hebrews 10:14 | 2 Thessalonians 2:13
1 Corinthians 1:30
- Colossians 3:5-10 | John 15:1-8 | Romans 6:16-23

2 Thessalonians 2:13 But we ought always to thank God for you, brothers and sisters loved by the Lord, because God chose you as first fruits to be saved through the sanctifying work of the Spirit and through belief in the truth.
